

Information on Funding for Travel and Guests

MATH+ provides funding to its members for travel expenses and guests with the goal to promote an active scientific exchange with mathematicians and cooperation partners worldwide. The following rules apply:

In the interest of enabling as many people as possible to travel, MATH+ will only cover travel and accommodation costs but does not pay any per diem allowances!

It is imperative to contact the MATH+ Office or the contact persons at the institutions BEFORE you book a trip, issue an invitation, or attend (online) conferences!!!! If you do not, there is no guarantee that MATH+ will cover the costs.

Doctoral / BMS students

Doctoral students in MATH+ are encouraged to start building an international network of colleagues and collaborators early on. Hence, funding is available for all doctoral students regardless of their funding, be it a BMS scholarship, a position within a MATH+ project, or any other source of funding.

Phase I students: 1 trip to a conference/workshop/summer school during Phase I

Phase II students: 1 trip per year

Postdoctoral researchers and other MATH+ members

The participating institutes in MATH+ (FU, HU, TU, WIAS, ZIB) receive 20,000 EUR p.a. for travel costs. Decisions on how these funds are spent rest locally with the respective institutes! Please address your questions to the contact persons named overleaf. It is expected that the MATH+ research agenda will benefit from trips funded by MATH+.

The MATH+ Board decided that these funds should be **spent primarily to fund travels for postdoctoral researchers!**

Guest researchers

In addition, the participating institutes receive 10,000 EUR p.a. for invitations to guest researchers, from which costs for travel and accommodation can be paid. It is expected that guests financed by MATH+ contribute to its research agenda. Please check at your institute to what amount expenses can be covered before issuing an invitation!
